

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF AVON LAKE TO SELL USED SHOTGUNS AT FAIR MARKET VALUE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Police Department of the City of Avon Lake ("Police Department") presently has 14 Remington 870 shotguns ("shotguns") previously purchased for use by some of the members of the Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department has determined that 11 of the shotguns no longer suit its needs and should be sold; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department has obtained a quote for the fair market value of the shotguns to be sold ("quote"); and

WHEREAS, the Police Department desires to first offer the shotguns for sale to its members at the same fair market value as represented by the quote and to sell any remaining shotguns at auction in accordance with normal procedures for the sale of surplus or no longer needed items.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF AVON LAKE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section No. 1: That Council hereby authorizes the Police Department of the City of Avon Lake to sell 11 of its Remington 870 shotguns at fair market value.

Section No. 2: That Council hereby authorizes the Police Department of the City of Avon Lake to first offer the Remington 870 shotguns to its members at the fair market value and then to sell any remaining Remington 870 shotguns at auction in accordance with normal procedures utilized by the City of Avon Lake for the sale of surplus or no longer needed items.

Section No. 3: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section No. 4: That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, the emergency being the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, morals, convenience, and the general welfare of the community. Therefore,

this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and immediately after passage and approval by the Mayor.
