The Avon Lake Community Council is a volunteer-led community of local service groups, organizations, businesses and sports programs. The Community Council, which currently includes 23 organizations, meets four times a year to share knowledge and work together to assist each other with membership, fundraising and resource sharing. At the most recent meeting, organizations discussed scholarships that are available for college students. In 2009, the Community Council began sponsoring an event, which acknowledges and recognizes the great things members of our community are accomplishing. Citizen of the Year honors a volunteer for outstanding achievements in the area of community service, and Project of the Year honors a project that merits community-wide recognition.

Avon Lake Community Television

Avon Lake Community Television (ALC-TV) is part of the Digital Media Department of the City of Avon Lake. Located in the lower level of the Avon Lake Public Library, ALC-TV is comprised of two channels: government access and public access.

ALC-TV's Government Access Channel provides a means of communicating government activities, issues, legislation, events and meetings. Through taped and live productions, including the Avon Lake City Council and Avon Lake Board of Municipal Utilities meetings, and a computerized bulletin board, the staffed station works to keep the citizens of Avon Lake aware, informed and active in local and regional levels of government.

ALC-TV's Public Access Channel provides an "open forum" television format for all residents, organizations, clubs and businesses of Avon Lake to produce noncommercial, informational programming. "Fitness for Every Body" and "Indelible Impression with TeeMcBee" are the newest shows joining our Public Access line-up this year.

Shop Local-Shop Avon Lake Week

For several years, the City of Avon Lake has been celebrating its small businesses in late November. It began with observing Small Business Saturday two days after Thanksgiving. In 2018, it was decided to lengthen the celebration from a day to a week—partially because Small Business Saturday is also "Ohio State v. Michigan Saturday," and many Avon Lakers stayed at home to watch the big game.

To increase interest in this year's Shop Local—Shop Avon Lake Week, the City introduced the Shop Local—Win Local raffle. Local shops and restaurants donated a \$50 gift card to be featured in the event marketing. Each gift card contributed to the grand prize in the "onewinner-takes-all" raffle, which totaled over \$1,800. Each customer of these participating businesses received a raffle ticket with a purchase of \$10 or more.

The 2019 Shop Local-Shop Avon Lake Week was held November 29 through December 7. At the end of the nine-day celebration, special ticket boxes were collected from participating businesses, containing approximately 10,000 tickets. On December 13, Parker's Grille & Tavern hosted an event where Mayor Zilka pulled the ticket filled out by the grand prize winner-Karen Hutman. During Shop Local-Shop Avon Lake Week, Ms. Hutman and her mother had enjoyed lunch at Salad KraZe and filled out one ticket. One ticket was enough! Karen won 35 different gift cards, which were presented to her at Salad KraZe on December 16."I would iust like to thank all the local businesses that donated to this contest," said Hutman. "Their generosity is truly appreciated. I look forward to visiting their stores and restaurants."

Issue 2 - Tax Levy (Renewal)

The 2020 Primary Election in the State of Ohio is March 17, 2020. On this date, registered voters in Avon Lake will consider candidates for local, state and national offices and Issue 2. Issue 2 is a five-year renewal of the tax levy for the City's operating expenses, which generates \$1,028,572 annually. The last tax levy renewal was in 2014. The renewal will not increase the taxes currently collected by Lorain County. A vote in favor of the tax levy will ensure that residents continue to receive quality City services.

2020 Capital Improvement Budget Highlights

City Council unanimously approved the 2020 Budget at the Special Council Meeting on December 30, 2019.

Public Works Department: Street Program - \$2,000,000; Webber Road Improvements - \$300,000; Sidewalk Repair Program - \$30,000; LED Crosswalk Lights - \$69,000; Weiss Park Improvements - \$200,000. Police Department: three Police Vehicles - \$102,000 and School Bus Transportation Video System - \$40,000.

Since the Fire Department purchased a new \$600,000 fire truck in 2019, minimal capital improvements, such as turnout gear (\$18,000) and computer replacements (\$22,000) were budgeted for 2020.

The Walker Road Park Retention Expansion budget is \$280,000. Walker Road Park is owned jointly with Bay Village and the budgeted amount is Avon Lake's 50% share.

A community-led group approached City leaders with their concept to update the Avon Lake Play Space (ALPS) at Bleser Park built in 1994. City Council approved a budget of \$25,000 for a design study.
